

Camp Rules for Leaders

Please familiarize yourself with the camp rules. Some of the rules are required by the facility itself, while others are recommended to create the best possible environment at camp. Each leader is responsible for making sure youth follow the rules of camp.

General

- Students are to respect all adult leaders and follow their instructions. All adults – members of the camp leadership team, church leadership teams, and adult volunteers – are in places of authority over all students. They have been trained and instructed in how to guide students for each particular event.
- Students are to stay in the cafeteria until they are released by their leaders.
- Try to get the youth to bed at the assigned time. Believe us.
- All youth are required to be in one of the designated supervised areas. If they wish to go to another area, they need to be escorted by a counselor or leader.
- If a youth requires assistance from a leader for anything they should seek a leader of the same gender. Under no circumstances should a male leader be alone with a female youth and vice versa.

Health

- All campers, counselors, and other people attending the camp must fill out a medical/registration form. Any person 18 or under must have the form signed by their parent or legal guardian. These forms must be presented to Calvary South Austin with final payment.
- Youth will be expected to monitor any allergies to food while at camp. If your youth is a special exception, then please notify the leader from your church in addition to filling out that information on the medical release form.
- All medications must be listed on this medical release form and must be taken to the medical staff at the camp. Medications are not allowed to be stored in the dorms. All medications must be in the original bottle and/or container. Medications will be administered as per RX label instructions and dosage, unless written, signed, and dated parental instructions state otherwise. Students are not to share any medications, including over-the-counter drugs. The medical staff at camp will not administer the medication if these requirements are not met.
- Leaders should not give any medications, including over the counter, to any youth. It is impossible to know the youth's medical background, so if any medications are needed the youth should be escorted to the health center.
- Students who are ill or injured must be either in the camp office, medical clinic, or hospital. In the event of illness or injury, students will not be permitted to remain in dorm rooms.
- All snack items must be stored in sealable containers to prevent ants and other insects in the dorms and meeting rooms. Texas Department of Health Regulations prohibits cooking in dorms or meeting rooms (no hot plates, electric skillet, etc.)

Safety

- Adult supervision is required at the lake and/or pool. At no time is a student to go to the lake and/or pool without adult supervision. Lifejackets are required for lakefront activities, regardless of a person's age or ability.

Respect

- Beds must be visible. Sheets may not be used as drapes.
- Please familiarize yourself with the "What to Bring/Camp Rules" document for other issues.

Male/Female Interaction Detail

- If a couple sets itself apart from the group, but are within a reasonable distance to the group, they bear watching. If it looks like it is becoming a pattern, they may need to be spoken to. This should be by consensus of several leaders, not an individual decision. We are not attempting to squelch innocent conversation and interaction; however, we do want to direct all interactions into appropriate directions.
- If couples are found alone (even if they are in sight of the group but could slip out of sight):
 - They will receive 1 warning
 - They cannot interact together for the duration of the camp without a leader present
 - If they are found alone again, they will be sent home.
- Please understand that this is for the protection of the campers, the youth leaders, the churches involved, and the camp. We want no harm to come to any involved, and we do not, in any way, want to bring reproach to the name of Christ.
