

What to Bring & Camp Rules

Essentials

- Bible
- Notebook and pen

Apparel

- 1 week's worth of clothing
 - Clothing probably will get dirty, so new clothes are not recommended
 - Clothing should reflect a godly attitude, and not divert attention of those around you from their focus on God's word and His purpose in their lives
 - Youth will be required to change if any of the following are noticed:
 - Shorts whose length is above the fingertips
 - Crop tops, sheer clothing, or navels showing
 - Spaghetti strap shirts
 - Clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco, or suggestive/offensive sayings
- Swimsuit/Trunks
 - Swimsuits must be covered by a colored t-shirt and shorts at all times
 - Boys must wear a t-shirt, as well
- Pajamas
- Cap/Hat
- Shoes (sports and/or hiking)

Dorm Gear

- Bath Towel
- Beach Towel
- Pillow
- Blanket
- Sleeping bag
- Laundry/Trash bag (for dirty clothes)
- Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, deodorant)
- Prescriptions
 - Must be in original pharmaceutical packaging with correct name, dosage, and date on the label
 - Place all medication together in a plastic zip-loc type bag
 - Document medications/allergies on the camp registration form
 - Medicine will be administered by camp
- Sunscreen
- Bug repellent
- Ear plugs

Survival Gear

- Flashlight
- Water Bottle
- Snacks
- Spending money (concessions, gift shop, CDs)
- Watch
- Board Games

Items not allowed

If any of the following items are brought to camp they will be confiscated by a counselor and will be given to the youth leader from your church. The youth will receive their items back when camp is over.

- Portable Electronic Devices
 - Cell phones (youth leaders should provide their contact info to parents in case they need to contact their child)
 - Music (iPod, Zune, etc.)
 - Gaming (Sony PSP, Nintendo DS, etc.)
 - Computing (Laptop, iPad, Kindle, Nook, etc.)
- Water Guns
- Prank supplies (shaving cream, body paint, etc.)
- Weapons (guns, knives, etc.)
- Skateboards and/or Rollerblades
- Pets

Rules

- Youth will be expected to monitor what kind of food they eat while at camp. If your youth has a food allergy, please notify a leader from your church and document this info in the camp registration form.
- Over the counter medicine is not allowed in the dorms. All medicine should be administered by the camp nurses.
- All snack items must be stored in sealable containers.
- Public displays of affection are not allowed.
- Boys or girls are not allowed to be alone together.
- Under no circumstances are girls to be in/near the boys' dorm, or boys in/near the girls' dorm.
- No fighting is allowed.
- All students are required to respect all adult leaders and follow their instructions.
- All youth are required to be present at planned activities.

Depending on severity of the rule, if broken, a student will be warned by a camp leader. Repeat offenses will require the student to be sent home from camp. Some severe cases will require the student to be sent home from camp immediately. Please understand that these rules are in place for the protection of the campers, youth leaders, churches involved, and the camp. We want no harm to come to any involved, and we do not, in any way, want to bring reproach to the name of Christ.
